

## 2010 Handicap Series – Caboolture Road Runners



The CRR Handicap Series kicks off in the “Year of the Tiger” with our first events on Sunday 14 March 2010. This year sees the introduction of a new format including a 10k and 5k series (see website for rules and starting handicaps). Following dates and venues are tentative to avoid clashes with other events – watch the website for updates.

- Race 1 Macca’s Mansion 280 Robinson Rd Mt Mee. March 14, 8am. It can be cool and crisp in the rarified Mt Mee mountain air, but not as brisk as in Siberia, the home of the biggest of the tigers, called what?
- Race 2 ~~Centenary Lakes Caboolture~~ Brennan Park Bribie Island. April 26, 68am (this is a Monday, public holiday ANZAC day). Tigers are camouflaged with stripes and body colours of white, black and orange or gold – bit like CRRs really. If you shaved a tiger would it still have stripes? What if you shaved a genuine CRR?
- Race 3 May 9 23. Steve will be looking after this one while I’m overseas so it could be at Morayfield or where ever else he sets it. Tigers sleep around 18 hours every day, true or false? So does Steve, true or false?
- Race 4. **Saturday June 26 20 6, 8am. Woodford see entry forms at track Toorbul Point.** A group of tigers is called a what? You sometimes see these at the cricket.
- Race 5. July 11, 8am. Beerburrum State School – yes, it will include a small climb. Tigers mark their territory by spraying what, over trees, plants and occasionally their feet? Remind you of some CRRs?
- Race 6. August 15, 8am. Redcliffe. The tendons in a tiger’s leg are so strong that an animal has been known to remain standing after it has been shot, true or false? Most CRR’s can remain standing after a race, but always look like they have been shot – with a cannon.
- Race 7. September 19. Delaney’s Creek, Cookies Castle, 8am. On average a tiger eats 27.2 kilos of meat but can subsist on vegetation like the Slow Match Tree, true or false? Most CRRs consume their own body weight in sausages at our regular BBQs, but these aren’t really meat. And some do survive on veges alone.
- Race 8. October 10. Centenary Lakes, 8am, for the grand finale. Usually before mating, but also as a sign of affection, tigers make a kind of chuffing
